AN AFTERNOON FOR FUN AND EXPLORATION

This is our third edition, and our focus remains the same: for **everyone involved to have fun**, feel safe and appreciated, and discover new crafts with passionate individuals.

The Happy Pikin Festival (HPF) aims to be a third space for children outside of school and home, where they can safely **express themselves** around grown-ups who believe in self-expression. HPF curates an afternoon of fun where children can try their hand at new skills without fear of academic performance or parental pressure. It's a safe space where one can make mistakes, be goofy, speak up, share their experiences, and hear others'.

We want to give **access** to sports, arts, storytelling, and hopefully, next year, science.

RESOURCES

For the past three years, our program has flourished with delightful activities, all made possible by an **incredible team of volunteers and professionals.**

This wouldn't have been achievable without the generous support of **Aunty Ayo International School,** which graciously hosts the festival each year in their accommodating premises, featuring 500m2 of wellmaintained green fields and classrooms for indoor activities.

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Beyond the premises, the school staff's **support** and involvement **from the start** allow for great planning and execution of the festival.

READING CORNER

VISUAL ARTS

CALIFORNIA

Thanks to Isabelle, a young graduate from Obafemi Awolowo University who majored in architecture, we were able to organize a painting session.

Children were provided with a piece of paper, a pencil, brushes, and paint to draw whatever they liked.

We now have a robust collection of over 30 pieces of their artistic creations. While it may not be entirely exhibition-ready, Happy Pikin Festival definitely took notice of their remarkable work :)

PHOTO-PORTRAIT

SLENCE

This activity was led by Kasia Strek, a renowned Paris-based photographer from Poland.

Her workshop with the children focused on portrait pictures.

Photography holds a significant place in Happy Pikin Festival as it provides another magical way to tell a story.

MENSTRUATION & HEALTH

Talking about menstruation is not always easy; sometimes it's considered taboo, sometimes it brings feelings of shame or embarrassment, and sometimes it's just the fear of asking questions.

In this workshop, Scarlet Drop Foundation shared their first-time bleeding experience, along with the panic that followed, just before the isolation and loneliness of not being able to talk to anyone.

This workshop was a new addition, aligning with our goal of creating safe spaces for children and soon-to-be young adults to express themselves.

PODCAST RADIO

This is a new workshop, facilitated by TMT, one of the podcast anchor of Submarine and roach.

In this activity, he reversed the roles and had children interview him, allowing them to become little journalists for a short afternoon.

SELF-DEFENSE

This class was led by Stanley, a professional trainer who focuses not only on the body but also on the mind. His message is as powerful as his moves.

Before each session, children are encouraged to embrace selfconfidence, practice self-control, avoid promoting violence, and develop the ability to defend themselves when necessary.

This workshop is consistently popular with kids, both boys and girls alike.



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BOXING

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ELM

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This is another sport that promotes physical fitness, coordination, and instills self-confidence from a young age.

Through the trainer's exercises, children learn respect for others, selfcontrol, patience, endurance, focus, and technique

DANCE

At the end of the day, there's nothing like dancing together to conclude the festival.

School staff, volunteers, children, and sometimes parents, all alike, join in the dance to the sweetest beats.

Next year, we plan to include dance as a standalone activity, where we can learn the latest Nigerian dance moves.

GAMES

For the little ones, sometimes, a little toss and shoot to work out their motor skills is all you need.

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Too small to engage in sports with the older kids and too energetic to sit down and listen to a story, this allows them to play at their own rhythm.

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LESSONS LEARNED

Our recipe works: Have fun, show love, keep it inclusive, keep it simple!

We have **learned so much** from both the first and second editions. We now understand more than ever the importance of **catering** and **gift bags**. We've learned to manage access and **crowd control** using wristbands. Over time, we've been able to foster a genuine **team spirit** across all stakeholders.

Next year, we may **explore ways to restrict access for parents** and non-volunteers to the event so that staff, volunteers, and children can freely enjoy their afternoon without parental interruptions. We couldn't have anticipated the **success of visual arts.** With over 30 children at all times in that workshop, there was painting everywhere—on the papers, the walls, and even on their faces. We wanted self-expression, and we got it!

Next year, we will **allocate more resources to art workshops** (space, watercolour instead of acrylic, more pencils and papers) and perhaps if funds allow, provide materials for the children to keep.
